



Integrated Preschool Outreach Program (IPOP)

What is IPOP?

The York County School Division's (YCS D) IPOP is a language-based, preschool program offering a wide variety of enriching activities in a nurturing educational setting. IPOP is designed to serve children with and without disabilities in one preschool classroom. Children without disabilities serve as role models for children with developmental delays and other special needs. IPOP is a four-day program for preschool aged children without disabilities who reside in York County or who are children of YCS D employees. Children selected for the program attend their zoned IPOP school for three-hours, Monday-Thursday. The curriculum places emphasis on kindergarten readiness and socialization skills. IPOP teachers are fully licensed and have expertise in teaching children with a wide range of readiness levels.

How are children selected?

Children without disabilities are chosen to participate through an application process followed by a screening/play date. Applications and information are available at your zoned elementary school location. *

To be selected for the playdate, your child must be

- three years old by September 30
- a resident of York County or a child of a YCS D employee
- toilet trained
- demonstrate social behavior from which other preschoolers will learn

Parents interested in the program must complete an application and return it to their zoned IPOP school. Children who have successfully completed one school year in the IPOP program may be invited to participate the following school year. Parents interested in continuing in the IPOP program for a second year must sign a "letter of intent" and submit a \$100.00 non-refundable deposit. The deposit will be applied to the next school year's tuition

What are the costs?

A \$1,400 fee for materials, supplies, and tuition is required for students selected for the program. Fees are payable to your child's school:

- \$100 non-refundable deposit due at the time of acceptance to IPOP that will be applied towards tuition
- Four equal installments of \$325
- Returning students must complete a letter of intent with a \$100 deposit that will be applied towards IPOP tuition

Please note: The IPOP program requires parents to provide transportation to and from school.
