

Fiscal Year 2013 Budget Outlook December 5, 2011




Recap of FY10, 11 and 12 Budgets

- State revenue down \$12.6m (20%)
- Total operating budget reduced \$7.7m (6.2%)
- Cut 62 permanent positions (not temporary positions) by attrition
- Provided no raises, no step increases and no position re-grades




Operating Budget Comparisons

State Revenue – Key Dates

- Governor releases his proposed FY13 budget on December 19, 2011
- General Assembly convenes on January 11, 2012
- General Assembly scheduled to close session on or about
 March 11, 2012



Federal Impact Aid/DoD for FY13

- Level funding by Congress currently under a Continuing Resolution
- Continue counting students displaced by renovations at Bethel Manor
- FY13 impact aid preliminary estimate is \$9.45 million (level funding)
- Projecting an increase of \$29K in heavily impacted funds from DoD



Federal Revenue for FY13 (cont'd)

- If sequestration occurs, impact aid would be cut over 7%
- Under sequestration other federal grants such as Title I would be cut
- No federal Jobs Fund are available in FY13. In FY13
 14.41 Jobs Fund positions will go away that are funded in FY12



FY13 County Funding

- Unknown at this time
- Continued impact of closing of oil refinery on school division funding is unknown at this time
- There is no funding formula for the County contribution to School Division

Contractual services and bus fuel



Examples of possible expenditure <u>reductions</u> – Staff reductions would be by attrition <u>if possible</u>

- Central office staff
- Contractual services for instruction and operations
- Custodial / maintenance / technology staff
- Equipment / bus purchases
- Para-educators
- Staff development
- Teachers increase class size
- Technology refurbishment
- Supply purchases
